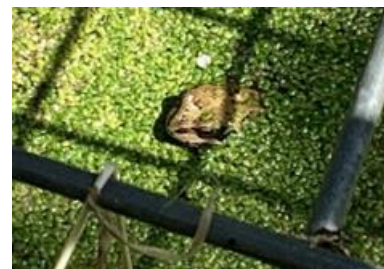
Forest School – a request
