Forest Schools

This week the children in year 2 enjoyed their first Forest schools session. Over the course of this term they will be developing the pond area into a lovely space which they will be able to use for outdoor learning. They have been very busy clearing and tidying the space and have started filling the greenhouse with seeds. Some of the older children helped with the clearing at lunchtime. As you can see everyone has had a wonderful time and worked collaboratively, making a huge difference in just one afternoon!

















NSPCC Workshops

Over the past two weeks the children have taken part in Speak out, Stay safe assemblies within their own classrooms. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recoanise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or to Childline. Following-on from the assembly, specially trained NSPCC volunteers,

accompanied by their Mascot Buddy, came in to school this morning to deliver workshops to our Year 2, 5 and 6 children. This is to build-on and deepen pupils' learning gained from the assembly.

Parent Behaviour

We have had several incidents of parents/carers being abusive to staff, our neighbours and other parents/carers and driving aggressively on the lane outside school at pick up and drop-off times. Please could I remind parents that unless there is a specific reason, they should not to drive up the lane outside school at any time for the safety of everyone. This includes drop off at breakfast club in the morning when our fruit/ food deliveries and our staff are arriving. Staff should be able to park their cars outside school without being sworn at by parents, and children should not have to witness this on their way in to school in a morning. Thank you for your help with this matter.

Year 5 Bike day

On Monday 10th June our Year 5 pupils will be taking part in a whole class bike day led by ex Olympic cyclist Phil Bateman from pro-ride cycling for schools. The day will consist of some training, challenges and games as well as some racing on the field. Phil will then be hosting a tournament on Thursday 13th June at Skipton Academy for schools in the Craven area, and 8 of our children will be chosen to compete in this as a race team. More information will be sent out nearer the time, but we wanted to give plenty of notice in case children want to practice their cycling, and because they will need to bring their bikes and helmets to school on that day. Phil has a limited amount of spare bikes if any child cannot get theirs to school on the day.

Reception visit to Hesketh Farm - Tuesday 14th May 2024

In order to enhance our Science curriculum, we will be carrying out an educational visit to Hesketh Farm on Tuesday 14^a May 2024. Children will have the opportunity to weigh, mix and prepare feed for lambs or calves and then feed them. They will enjoy a tractor ride with Farmer Chris and carry out a paddock walk where they will discuss trees, animal homes and animals in the paddock. They will also be able to enjoy a cuddle with a guinea pig. See letter sent today for further details.
