Year 1 Spring term 1 Curriculum Map 2023

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<p>The key text we will be looking at is Wombat goes walk about by Micheal Morpurgo. We will be working on an independent writing piece based on this text. Over this half term we will be developing our understanding of sentence structure and including adjectives to improve sentences.</p> <p>For our non-fiction unit we are going to write a travel journal based on a place of interest.</p>
Maths	<p>In maths we are focusing on place value within 20. Children will develop their confidence in counting and securing an understanding of teen numbers to 20. Then moving on to 1 more 1 less, using number lines, estimating, comparing and ordering numbers within 20.</p>
Science	<p>In science we are learning about materials. The children will compare different everyday materials, such as wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard. The children will investigate the suitability of these objects for different uses and look at how the shapes of these objects could be changed through squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. The children will develop their understanding of the properties of these objects and be able to group them on the basis of their properties.</p>
Geography	<p>In geography we are focusing on the unit people and their communities. In this unit, the children will look at different world journeys. The children will start with their local area and then look at coastal, dry (dessert), rainforest and world city locations. The children will develop an understanding of the similarities and differences between these locations and begin to understand about the different continents in the world and will use maps, photographs, virtual and imagined journeys to support their understanding.</p>
Art	<p>In art the children will create different 3D sculptures using paper. The children will understand that three-dimensional art is called a sculpture and will develop different skills in paper play, such as rolling, folding and scrunching and that these skills can change paper from 2D to 3D. The children will also begin to develop their measuring and cutting skills.</p>
Music	<p>In music the children will focus on two songs; Rhythm in the Way We Walk (Reggae) and Banana Rap (Hip-Hop). The children will listen and appraise these two songs, as well as other songs in the Reggae and Hip-Hop style. The children will use different musical and singing games to understand the different features involved in these songs and their style.</p>
P.E.	<p>P.E. on Wednesdays will be led by Skipton tennis. pupils develop their sending and receiving skills including throwing and catching, rolling, kicking, tracking and stopping a ball. Pupils will be given opportunities to work with a range of different sized balls. They will apply their skills individually, in pairs and in small groups and begin to organise and self-manage their own activities. They will understand the importance of abiding by the rules to keep themselves and others safe.</p> <p>In P.E. on Friday year 1 will explore travelling actions, movement skills and balancing. They will understand why it is important to count to music and use this in their dances. Pupils will copy and repeat actions linking them together to make short dance phrases. Pupils will work individually and with a partner to create ideas in relation to the theme. Pupils will be given the opportunity to perform and also to provide feedback, beginning to use dance terminology to do so.</p>

R.E.	In R.E. the children will look at some of the key beliefs of Muslims and will be able to give examples of how stories about the Prophet show what Muslims believe about Muhammad. The children will be able to give examples of how Muslims use the Shahadah to show what matters to them and look at Muslims prayers, ways of living and celebrations.
P.S.H.E	In P.S.H.E. the children will be looking at the meaning of dreams and goals. The children will develop an understand as to how to stay motivated when faced with challenges and how to work well with other people or in a group. The children will learn what having a positive attitude means and looks like and will set their own dreams and goals and look at how they're working to achieve them.
Computing	In computing the children will be developing their coding skills. They will firstly secure an understanding of what coding is and that computer programs work by following instructions called code. Throughout this unit the children will plan and use coding to create a programme.
