



**Year 5 Autumn Term 2 Curriculum Map 2023**

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	In their narrative work, the children will focus on the story ' <b>Gorilla</b> ' by <b>Anthony Browne</b> . The children will use this story to craft and construct different sentences which will develop the children's understanding of grammar, spelling and punctuation knowledge. They will then complete an independent write, enabling them to apply what they've learned from this unit. The children will then move onto <b>Poetry</b> and will focus on building vocabulary to write a poem and will be able to read, write and perform free verse poetry.
Maths	The children will begin by looking at <b>Multiplication and Division</b> . In this unit, they will look at the difference between multiples and factors and will look at common multiples and common factors between different numbers. They will learn about prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers. They will then look at ways of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. They will then move onto <b>Fractions</b> . In this unit, the children will find equivalent fractions of unit and non-unit fractions and how to recognise equivalent fractions. They will then learn ways of adding and subtracting different types of fractions including fractions with the same denominator, mixed numbers, fractions within 1 and fractions with a total greater than 1.
Science	<b>Earth and Space</b> – In this unit, the children will learn about the Sun and Moon and the 8 planets in our Solar System, the order of which they are in and be able to describe features of each planet. The children will be able to describe the movements of the Earth, Sun and Moon in relation to each other and will be able to use this understanding to explain how day and night occurs.
History	<b>Anglo-Saxons</b> – In this unit, the children will learn about Anglo-Saxon Britain and how Britain changed after the Romans had left. The children will learn why the Anglo-Saxons settled in England and will be able to explain how they lived. The children will learn about significant events that occurred during Anglo-Saxon Britain and will use key documents to find evidence about Anglo-Saxon Britain.
DT	<b>Electronic Greeting Cards</b> – In this unit, the children will explore making circuits using graphite as a conductor. They will design a greeting card and will use their knowledge of circuits and electricity from Year 4 to create an electronic greeting card.
Music	<b>Young Voices</b> – In this unit, the children will learn and practise the songs for their upcoming Young Voices concert in February.
P.E.	<b>Invasion Games</b> – The children's PE will be delivered by <b>Kanga Sports</b> and they will continue to build on their skills and knowledge from invasion games from Autumn 1. The children will apply the skills they've developed in Autumn 1 into a variety of invasion games including football, hockey and basketball.
R.E.	<b>What will make our town/village a more respectful place?</b> – In this unit, the children will learn about the different religious and non-religious beliefs of communities in our local area. The children will investigate ways in which belonging to a religious community can help people and how faith and beliefs have had an impact on the lives of inspirational figures. The children will then learn about the difficulties for people of different religious and non-religious beliefs.

<b>P.S.H.E.</b>	<b><u>Celebrating Differences</u></b> – In this unit, the children will look at cultural differences and will learn that cultural differences can sometimes cause conflict. They will learn what racism is and be made aware of their own attitudes towards people of different races. They will then look at different types of bullying and be made aware of how to recognise these different types. The children will then compare their lives with people in the developing world.
<b>Computing</b>	<b><u>Online Safety</u></b> – In this unit, the children will look at how to protect themselves online and look at appropriate and inappropriate online behaviours. The children will look at how to maintain secure passwords and how to protect their personal information online. The children will be made aware of the differences between appropriate and inappropriate text, photographs and videos they may come across online and through different methods of communication, such as emails, and look at the impact of sharing these online. They will also learn how to reference sources in their work and how to consider the reliability of different sources.
