Year 5 Summer Term 1 Curriculum Map 2024

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	In their narrative work, the children will focus on the story <u>'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell</u> . The children will use this story to craft and construct different sentences which will develop the children's understanding of grammar, spelling and punctuation knowledge. The children will then complete an independent write, enabling the children to apply what they have learned from this unit.
Maths	The children will continue with their learning of <u>decimals and percentages</u> . In this unit, the children will learn how to order and compare decimals using their place value understanding. The children will then learn to round decimals to the nearest whole number and to 1 decimal place. The children will also find equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. The children will then move onto <u>perimeter and area</u> , followed by <u>statistics</u> . In perimeter and area, the children will learn to find the perimeter of rectangles, rectilinear shapes and polygons. The children will also learn to find the area of rectangles and compound shapes. In statistics, the children will learn how to draw and interpret graphs and tables that represent different statistics.
Science	<u>Consolidation</u> – In this unit, the children will revisit, consolidate and build on prior knowledge from previous Science units (animals including humans, Earth and space, materials and properties and forces). The children will develop their working scientifically skills within these units and will take part in various scientific experiments which link to these units.
Geography	<u>Trade: Where does all our stuff come from?</u> – In this unit, the children will find out about the UK's global trade links, investigating where everyday products come from and the journeys they take to our homes. The children will also map the journeys taken by items, and research the pros and cons of buying local or imported goods.
Art	Painting and Mixed Media: Portraits – In this unit, the children will engage in opportunities to develop skills in creating interesting portrait drawings using words, experimenting with materials and techniques and constructing self-portraits that represent aspects of themselves. The children will develop their understanding and application of art vocabulary and will be encouraged to make thoughtful decisions in their artwork composition.
Music	Fresh Prince of Bel Air – In this unit, the learning is focused around the song 'Fresh Prince of Bel Air' by Will Smith. The children will take part in a variety of games and activities, which will help them to learn about the different dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.) within the song. The children will learn to sing the song and then use recorders to play the song instrumentally.
P.E	Football – In this unit, the children will develop their understanding of attacking and defending principles of invasion games. In all games and activities, they will have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. The children will also develop their understanding of the importance of fair play and honesty while self-managing games and learning and abiding by key rules of the games.
R.E	Why is pilgrimage important to some religious believers? – In this unit, the children will learn the difference between a place that is considered 'special' and a place that is considered 'holy' or 'sacred'. The children will learn about the role of pilgrimage across different religions and will learn about the similarities and differences between ways in which people undertake pilgrimage. The children will also be able to link the stories that lie behind sites, times and places of pilgrimage.
P.S.H.E	<u>Relationships</u> – In this unit, the children will learn about relationships in their life. The children will look at how to build their own self-esteem and will be able to create an accurate picture of who they are as a person, in terms of their qualities and characteristics. The children will then learn about how to stay safe within an online community and understand there are rights and responsibilities in an online community or social network. The children will then evaluate their own relationship with devices, technology and screen time.
Computing Tel: 01756	Game Creator – In this unit, the children will create their own game around a selected theme. The children will learn that a good game designer gives the player continuous challenges in a visually stunning environment, each of which leads to another challenge, to keep the game challenging and fun. The children will play both their own game and their peers' games. The children will then learn the importance of evaluating and will use this knowledge to evaluate their own game and their peers' games, so that they can be improved.





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French	School Trip – This unit is all about school trips. It introduces vocabulary to talk about the journey, including the
	French version of "The Wheels on the Bus", and words associated with trips to a museum and the countryside.
	The unit includes sentences in both the present and future tenses, giving pupils the opportunity to learn new
	sentence structures.
