Year 6 Spring Term 1 Curriculum Map 2024

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<u>No One Is Too Small To Make A Difference</u> Pupils will be reading and exploring the speech 'No One Is Too Small To Make A Difference' by Greta Thunberg. Pupils will investigate the structure of the speech and significant grammatical features of this text, such as the use of modal verbs, colons and complex sentences. Pupils will use the structure from shared writing to plan and write their own persuasive speech about plastic pollution.
Maths	<u>Ratio and Algebra</u> Within our Maths topics this half term, pupils will work on skills such as using ratio language, understanding the similarities and differences between ratios and fractions, solving ratio problems and using simple formulae.
Science	<u>Electricity</u> In this unit of work pupils will begin by learning how to draw a Scientific diagram of a circuit. Through practical investigation work they will find out how the voltage in a circuit affects the brightness of a bulb. They will then work collaboratively to plan and carry out a fair test to investigate variations in how components function.
Geography	<u>Protecting the environment</u> The children will consider if we are damaging our world and how we can protect it. The children will investigate energy production, the oceans and minerals, as well as conducting an enquiry into how the school can become more sustainable.
Art	<u>Making my voice heard</u> In this unit of work pupils will compare different styles of art such as street art and Maya art. They will participate in discussions that examine the similarities and differences between different styles of art and form their own opinions about what art is. They will learn how artists use art to tell stories and will create their own powerful image which conveys a message that is important to them.
Music	<u>Classroom Jazz 2</u> Pupils will investigate Jazz and Blues music. Their learning will focus around two songs- 'Bacharach Anorak' and 'Meet the Blues' and will perform these songs in their appropriate styles. Pupils will work together to compose and perform their own blues music.
P.E	<u>Gymnastics and Yoga</u> Pupils will have P.E lessons on a <u>Monday</u> and <u>Friday</u> . In Gymnastics lessons, pupils will work on developing and mastering rolls, jumps and balances. They will work collaboratively in groups to link actions and develop effective sequences. Within their Yoga unit of work, pupils will learn about mindfulness and body awareness. They will learn yoga poses and techniques that will help them to connect their mind and body and will work on improving their wellbeing by building strength, flexibility and balance.
R.E	<u>How does religion help us through the good and bad times?</u> Within this unit of work pupils will draw together their previous learning about a Christian, Muslim, Hindu and non-religious beliefs. They will explore religious and non-religious responses to life and consider why some people find that religion can help them celebrate the good times in life but also to cope with the difficult times.
P.S.H.E	<u>Dreams and Goals</u> The children will reflect on their hopes and dreams, and consider how it feels to be disappointed when they don't achieve goals. They will consider ways to get through disappointments, and then work as a team to complete a project, before reflecting on their teamwork and considering how it could be improved.
Computing	<u>Spreadsheets</u> Pupils will use the program 2Calculate as a tool for computational modelling and problem solving. They will begin by creating a spreadsheet to answer a mathematical question relating to probability and will use the count tool and copy and paste shortcuts to help them in this investigation. Pupils will then progress onto using spreadsheets to help them come up with practical solutions to real-life situations and will have to use key tools such as the formula wizard to ensure their spreadsheet is efficient and their data is well-presented.
French	<u>Actions</u> During this unit, pupils will learn a selection of common verbs and how to use them with some simple adverbs. They will also learn some useful prepositions and will be able to recall some vocabulary associated with craft activities and treasure hunts.
