## Year 6 Summer Term 1 Curriculum Map 2024

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<b>Hidden Figures</b> Pupils will be using the text 'Hidden Figures' by Margot Lee Shetterly to inspire their writing. Pupils will begin by investigating the main themes in the text such as segregation and discrimination. They will then study the key features of a newspaper report such as a headline, past tense and direct and indirect speech. Pupils will create their own newspaper report based on the achievements of the characters in the text.
Maths	<b>Revision</b> In Maths this half term, pupils will revise their Y6 Maths learning and will also revisit content from lower Key Stage Two. Revision activities will be based on topics such as Number and Place Value, Calculations, Fractions, Decimals and Percentages and Shape.
Science	<b>Consolidation</b> Pupils will review all areas of Science by planning practical investigations and recapping essential knowledge.
Geography	<b>South America: The Amazon</b> Pupils will study the Amazon region of South America within this unit of work. They will begin by learning the nine countries which the Amazon region spans and will be able to locate the Amazon basin and Amazon River on a map of South America. They will investigate what life is like in the Amazon as well as how it is being damaged and how it can be protected.
Art	<b>Sculpture and 3D</b> Pupils will explore Sculpture and 3D art forms to help inspire them create a memory sculpture. Throughout this unit of work, pupils will study artists such as Louise Nevelson and Joseph Cornell to help them understand how art can represent abstract concepts. They will explore using cardboard and assembling objects to create different techniques before planning, designing and evaluate their own memory museum sculpture to celebrate their memories of primary school.
Music	<b>You've got a friend</b> Pupils will explore the music of Carole King. They will learn that 'You've got a friend' was a song written by Carole King in 1971 and will consider the key features and structure of the song. They will find out that in the 1960s, Carole King was employed to write pop songs for other artists to perform and the class will listen to and compare a selection of these songs.
P.E	<b>Rounders</b> Pupils will have P.E lessons on a <b>Monday</b> and <b>Friday</b> . Through their Rounders unit, pupils will learn the principles of striking and fielding games. They will develop the quality and consistency of their fielding skills and their understanding of when to use them such as throwing underarm and overarm, catching and retrieving a ball. They will also expand their knowledge of how to play the different roles of bowler, backstop, fielder and batter and to apply tactics in these positions.
R.E	<b>Creation and Science: Conflicting or complementary?</b> Pupils will investigate the creation story in Genesis and will learn that there is much debate and some controversy around the relationship between the account of creation in Genesis and contemporary scientific accounts. They will learn that Christians interpret and understand Genesis in different ways and will explore some of these viewpoints.
P.S.H.E	<b>Relationships</b> Throughout this unit of work, the children will further develop their understanding of mental health and strategies they can use to look after themselves and develop a positive mental health. They will also explore different emotions such as stress and grief. Furthermore, pupils will focus on online safety and how they can use technology safely and responsibly to communicate with their friends and family.
Computing	<b>Text Adventures</b> Pupils will use the Purple Mash program 2Create to investigate what a text-based adventure game and will then map out their own story-based text adventure using 2Connect. They will work on creating and testing their plan and will progress on to learn reading and understanding given code and implement improvements for their game.
French	<b>Family</b> During this unit, pupils will learn how to name extended family members and talk about the household tasks they do. They will also work on using familiar words and sentence structures to form new sentences.
