Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Autumn Term Two 2020) in **Class One**

Subject	Topics
Phonics	<p><i>Reception Pupils</i> will continue to learn the new sounds in phonics, moving on to Phase 3 <b>digraphs</b> and <b>trigraphs</b>. We will work on <b>blending</b> (reading) and <b>segmenting</b> (writing) CVC words, and develop skills in reading sentences and writing short captions. Reading books with words will be sent home when we are further along the phonics process when your child is blending words. <i>Year 1</i> pupils will learn alternative digraphs/split digraphs and work on Phase 5 phonics.</p> <p><i>Please continue to support your child with their homework (practice the correct letter formation, recognise phonics sounds, revisit tricky word flashcards, and listen to them read as regularly as possible) in order to encourage secure foundations for reading and writing. 'Practice makes perfect!'</i></p>
Literacy	<p>This half term in Literacy, pupils in Class One will begin by exploring rhyme. We will explore a book called <b>Stop Telling Fibs</b> where we will investigate rhyming words and rhyming activities. Pupils will write labels and lists for different purposes using their knowledge of phonics.</p>
Mathematics	<p>In Maths, Class One will be exploring <b>Numbers</b> and will focus on one number each week, from five up to ten. We will continue to gain a deepened understanding of number and develop 'number sense'. We will be presenting different aspects of number alongside each other to include number recognition, number formation, counting, place value, calculation, money and shapes.</p>
Music	<p>Class One will learn a variety of songs and actions and will perform a <b>Nativity</b> at St Mary's Church in December. Unfortunately due to COVID 19 restrictions, parents will not be able to attend this year, but there will be an option to purchase a professional DVD so that you don't miss your child's performance.</p>
P.E.	<p>During this half term Class One will continue to work with a specialist teacher learning <b>Fundamental Movement Skills</b>. Pupils will develop skills in the following:</p> <p><b>Spatial awareness</b> – this is a key skill to develop at an early age. It takes into account the ability to comprehend space between the body and other objects. As spatial awareness improves the ability to change position taking into account moving objects will be improved. This is a key skill for everyday life.</p> <p><b>Movement and Balance</b>. Being in control of the body whilst moving, stopping and starting.</p> <p><b>Sending and receiving skills</b> with the hand and feet. Processing objects moving away from the body and towards the body. We will mainly use a ball for this.</p>
R.E.	<p>Pupils will carry out a unit on <b>Incarnation</b>. In this unit we will explore the BIG question <b>What makes every single person unique and precious?</b> Pupils will think about how Christians believe Jesus' life shows just how important all people are and look at what the Bible says about Jesus. We will be visited by <b>North Yorkshire Police Sergeants</b> who will help to make links to physical differences such as DNA and finger/ear prints.</p>
PSHE	<p>Class One will be carrying out a unit on <b>Keeping myself safe</b>. This focuses primarily on key messages about safety. We will learn about road safety, safety around medicine and stranger danger.</p>
Computing Skills	<p>Computing lessons will not take place this half term due to <b>Nativity</b> rehearsals. Children will be able to access our class computer during continuous provision time.</p>
Science	<p>Science lessons will not take place this half term due to Nativity rehearsals.</p>
Topic	<p>Our topic for this half term is '<b>Let's Celebrate</b>'. Pupils will explore a variety of celebrations and learn about some family customs and traditions. We will explore this topic through a variety of art and design.</p>
