Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Summer Term One 2021) in **Class One**

Subject	Topics
Phonics	<p><i>Reception Pupils</i> will learn <b>Phase 4</b> phonics which includes blending for reading CVCC and CCVC words and segmenting for spelling CVCC and CCVC words. We will practice reading and spelling words with adjacent consonants, (for example pl, lf, cl, etc..) and develop reading and spelling of high-frequency words. Pupils will read and spell two-syllable words and practice reading and writing sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.</p> <p><i>Year 1</i> pupils will continue to learn alternative digraphs/split digraphs and work on applying <b>Phase 5</b> phonics. We will focus on sight reading and spelling of <b>Year 1 Common Exception Words</b> and develop sentence writing accordingly.</p> <p><b><i>Please continue to support your child with their homework (practice the correct letter formation, recognise phonics sounds, revisit tricky word flashcards, and listen to them read as regularly as possible) in order to encourage secure foundations for reading and writing. 'Practice makes perfect!'</i></b></p>
Literacy	<p>This half term in Literacy, pupils in Class One will focus on a <b>poetry</b> unit. Pupils will learn to perform a poem from memory using a variety of actions. They will explore rhyming words and learn to recognise rhyming couplets. Pupils will write their own verse of a rhyme.</p>
Mathematics	<p>In Maths, Reception children will carry out a unit on <b>place value</b> and look at composition of 10. We will explore <b>3D shapes</b> and learn to recognise, sort and make patterns. Finally, we will begin a unit on number patterns to 20.</p> <p><i>Year 1</i> pupils will focus on <b>Place Value</b> within 20 and <b>Addition and subtraction</b> within 20.</p> <p><b><i>Please continue to work on your KIRF Maths targets at home.</i></b></p>
Music	<p>Our Music focus this half term will be <b>Chanting and percussion</b>. Pupils will explore space through music, movement, chanting and the playing of instruments. We will also continue to learn to sing nursery rhymes and action songs.</p>
P.E.	<p>During this half term, pupils will carry out <b>Tennis</b> sessions delivered by Skipton Tennis Centre. Pupils will develop racket skills, and hand eye and body co-ordination. They will build on sending/receiving skills as well as spatial awareness. The sessions will have a focus on individual work and co-operative team work.</p>
R.E.	<p>In this unit pupils will explore <b>Judaism</b>. We will learn that there are many religions in the world and that people have different religious beliefs. Pupils will focus on Judaism and learn about how Jewish people live and what is important in their religion. We will learn about the Torah, a Synagogue and the festival of Hanukkah.</p>
Philosophy for Children (P4C)	<p>Pupils will consider a philosophical question each week based on a stimulus. They will learn to organise their thoughts and explain their thinking in clear sentences. Pupils will develop their thinking skills, confidence and speech and language skills, and learn to disagree agreeably.</p>
Computing Skills	<p>Class one will develop skills using the <b>Mini Mash</b> program on <b>Purple Mash</b>. They will explore and carry out a range of activities linked to different topics and areas of the curriculum.</p>
Science	<p>During Science lessons, Class One will carry out a unit called <b>The Potting Shed</b>. Pupils will learn to recognise and label parts of a plant. We will learn about, and sequence a plant life cycle and understand what plants need in order to survive. Pupils will also grow and care for a plant from a seed.</p>
Topic	<p>Our topic for this half term is <b>Spring to Life</b>. Pupils will learn about the changes in Spring time and explore changes in the local weather. We will investigate the life cycle changes that occur in butterflies and frogs.</p>
