

## Carleton Endowed CE (VA) Primary School

Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Spring One 2021) in Class 3 Year 2/3.

Subject	Topics
Literacy	<b>Stories with recurring literacy language</b> Pupils will be reading and exploring familiar stories written by Julia Donaldson through shared reading and drama tasks. They will compare and contrast the different key features found in these stories such as repetitive phrases and dialogue. Pupils will then use the model of one of these stories to write their own new story. <b>Spellings:</b> Pupils in Years Two and Three will continue to receive a list of spellings each week, which they will be expected to learn and practice at home. Please note pupils will be tested on these spellings in the classroom every <b>Friday</b> .
Numeracy	In Numeracy we will be looking at the areas of <b>Division and Statistics.</b> Within these topics, Year Two pupils will work on skills such as making tally charts, drawing pictograms and dividing by 2, 5 and 10. Year Three pupils will work on interpreting and presenting data using bar charts and tables and dividing two-digit numbers by one-digit numbers. All pupils will continue to work on their personal key instant recall facts which will improve their mental calculations and support the Numeracy work they are focusing on in school. It is important that pupils learn and practise this target at home each week as part of their Numeracy homework. Pupils will be tested on their target every <b>Tuesday</b> .
Science	<b>Healthy Me</b> In this unit of work pupils will learn about how humans and other animals are born, grow and change, and what we need to survive and be healthy. Pupils will classify different kinds of animal babies, learn about the basic needs that are shared by humans and animals, and research the differing needs of animals within our care. Pupils will also explore the need for humans to eat a varied diet, to keep themselves clean, and to take regular exercise.
Geography	<b>Food, Glorious Food!</b> Throughout this topic, pupils will link the everyday experience of buying and eating food within the UK with their growing geographical understanding if the world. Pupils will participate in field work within the local area to show them the connections between the food we buy and how much of it comes from the UK. They will learn about what farming is and what a farmer does. They will also find out about some of the traditional foods that originate in the UK.
Art and DT	<b><u>Cooking and Printing</u></b> Pupils will investigate and evaluate healthy food products. They will then plan, make and evaluate their own healthy snack.
Music	<b>Myths and Legends</b> In this unit of work pupils will learn what a graphic score is and will work on being able to identify the structure of a piece of music from its graphic score.
P.E.	<b>Sending and Receiving: Multi skills</b> Throughout the Spring Term the children will continue to have specialist PE lessons delivered by Skipton Tennis Centre on Thursday mornings. We will concentrate on improving sending and receiving skills with the view of improving overall co-ordination. This will be delivered through game based activities and will also include invasion games. The overall aim will be to improve passing a ball, receiving a ball, judging distance and chasing a ball.
R.E.	Who is a Muslim and what they do they believe? In this unit of work pupils will learn in depth about Islam. They will find out about Muslim ways of life, beliefs and festivals. This will then support pupils to develop thoughtful ideas and viewpoints of their own about some religious and spiritual questions.
P.S.H.C. E.	<u>My healthy lifestyle</u> Pupils will learn about the simple choices that we all can make to improve our physical and emotional health. They will also learn about how diseases are spread and how they can be controlled.
Computing	<b><u>Spreadsheets</u></b> Pupils will be able to explain what the rows and columns are in spreadsheet. They will create a table of data on a spreadsheet and will also use a spreadsheet to solve a mathematical puzzle.
French	<u>Core Unit Three</u> In this unit of work, pupils will cover parts of the body, the numbers 21 to 31, items of clothing and months of the year in the French language.
