Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Spring One 2021) in **Year 4/5 – Class Five**

Subject	Topics
Literacy	<p>The children will study the book, 'Weslandia' by Paul Fleischman. They will explore the language of the text in order to make predictions, describe Wesley's character and eventually retell the story in their own words. They will finally create their own civilization, based on 'Weslandia'.</p> <p><b>Class Reader will be Offside- Tom Palmer.</b></p> <p>Spellings: Pupils in Years four and five will receive a list of spellings each week which they will be expected to learn and practise at home. Please note pupils will be tested on these spellings in the classroom every <b>Friday</b>.</p>
Numeracy	<p>In this unit the children will: Multiply and divide numbers mentally drawing upon known facts. They will multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for 2-digit numbers.</p> <p>Divide numbers up to 4 digits by a 1-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately for the context.</p>
Science	<p><b>Teeth and Eating</b></p> <p>In this topic, the children will learn about digestion and different types of teeth, before moving on to explore deadly predators and their prey, in their exploration of food chains. They work scientifically throughout the topic, using enquiry, practical experiments and hands-on research to answer questions and investigate how we eat, why we eat and what we eat.</p>
Expedition (Geog, History, Art and DT)	<p><b>Journeys- Trade</b></p> <p>In this unit, the children will find out about the UK's global trade links, investigating where everyday products come from with the journeys they take to our homes. The children will also map the journeys taken by items, and research the pros and cons of buying local or imported goods.</p> <p><b>Art-</b> In this unit, the children will study the work of the artist – Giuseppe Arcimboldo and create 'Food' collage portraits.</p>
ICT	<p><b>Writing for different audiences</b></p> <p>In this unit, children learn that technology can be used to organise, reorganise, develop, and explore ideas, and that working with information in this way can aid understanding. It also gives children opportunities to discuss their experiences of using ICT and how it is used in the wider world.</p>
P.E.	<p><b>SENDING AND RECEIVING SKILLS – MULTI SKILLS</b></p> <p>We will concentrate on improving sending and receiving skills with the view of improving overall co-ordination. This will be delivered through game based activities and will also include invasion games. The overall aim will be to improve passing a ball, receiving a ball, judging distance and chasing a ball.</p>
R.E.	<p><b>How do religions help people live through good times and bad times?</b></p> <p>In this unit the children will study the connections between what people believe about God and how they respond to challenges about life.</p>
P.S.H.C.E.	<p><b>Active Citizen</b></p> <p>In this unit the children will study a unit about Fairtrade. They will learn how the choices we can make as individuals, a community and a nation impact internationally.</p>
French	<p><b>Seasons</b></p> <p>The four seasons, and activities that occur during these times of year. Pupils will also learn how to say the date, which is useful for a variety of situations. The unit rounds off with some useful arts and crafts vocabulary, and instructions in French for how to make a lantern for Chinese New Year.</p>
Music	<p><b>Pop UK-</b> The children will learn a range of songs from the <b>POP UK series</b> and learn guitar with the North Yorkshire Music Service.</p>
