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Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Autumn 1 2020) in Class 2.

Subject	Topics
During our first week back in school we will focus on themes, which promote self-efficacy , hope , gratitude and connectedness before moving onto our literacy topic.	
Literacy	This half term we will read and write a story about feelings , write an explanation text and explore new vocabulary for poetry . Pupils in Class 2 will receive a list of spellings at the beginning of each half term, which they will be expected to learn and practise at home each week. Pupils will be tested on these spellings in the classroom every <u>Friday</u> .
Numeracy	This half term, pupils in class 2 will be exploring Place Value . We will begin by recapping some basic understanding from the previous year before moving on to this year's curriculum. This will include counting, recognising and comparing numbers. Pupils will work on their personal key instant recall facts, which will improve their mental calculations and support the Numeracy work they are focusing on in school. It is important that pupils learn and practise these targets at home each week as part of their Numeracy homework. Pupils will be tested on their targets frequently, in class.
Science	Who Am I?: Pupils will be identifying, naming, drawing and labelling the basic parts of the human body. They will say which part of the body is associated with each sense. They will be working scientifically to observe closely, using simple equipment. Pupils will gather and record data to help in answering questions.
R.E.	Who Made the World? Pupils will retell the story of creation from Genesis 1:1–2.3. They will recognise that 'Creation' is the beginning of the 'big story' of the Bible. Pupils will explore what the story tells Christians about God, Creation and the world. Pupils will give examples of what Christians do to say thank you to God for the Creation. They will think, talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world.
Music	All About Me: Music lessons this half term will focus on pulse and rhythm. Pupils will listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music. They will play untuned instruments musically. Pupils will create sounds using the interrelated dimensions of music (rhythm) and use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.
P.E.	Multi-skills and playground games: Pupils will develop flexibility, core stability, strength, stamina, power and speed alongside skills that promote teamwork.
Geography	Our Local Area: This unit focuses on our immediate locality. The children will develop locational knowledge based on the view from the school and local walks. They will build place vocabulary to define where they live, which is deepened through fieldwork experiences and using maps.
Art	Painting and Collage: Pupils will be using the technique of wax resist to create autumn leaves. Drawing: Using the continuous line technique (Squiggle Drawing) pupils will be exploring autumn. They will explore the use of line, shape and colour □ They will use a variety of tools, inc. pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt tips, charcoal, ballpoints, chalk and other dry media. Pupils will use a sketchbook to gather and collect artwork.
Computing	Online Safety: Pupils will learn about how to stay safe online. They will also learn how to log on and off the computer and complete simple activities.
PSHCE	Me and My Relationships: In this unit pupils will learn about how to get along with each other. They will recognise that there are different types of relationships. They will explore right and wrong and how to work and play cooperatively. Pupils will also understand that they have the right to say 'no' and start thinking about who they trust and who they can ask for help.
