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Below is an outline of the work to be covered over the next half term (Autumn 1 2020) in Class 3.

| Subject | Topics |

| Literacy | Traditional Tales Pupils will be reading and exploring a selection of traditional tales. They will investigate the different characters, settings and events in these stories. Pupils will also look at how dialogue is used in traditional tales and will find out about how they can vary the structure of their sentences when writing a story. Pupils will then use structure from shared writing to write their own story based on a traditional tale. Spellings Pupils in Years Two and Three will continue to receive a list of spellings each week, which they will be expected to learn and practice at home. Please note pupils will be tested on these spellings in the classroom every Friday . |
| Numeracy | In Numeracy we will be looking at the areas of Place Value and Addition and Subtraction . Within these topics, Year Two pupils will work on skills such as reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals and words, comparing and ordering numbers from 0 to 100, recognising the place value of each digit in a two-digit number and solving addition and subtraction problems. Year Three pupils will work on skills such as reading and writing numerals to 1000 in numerals and words, comparing and ordering numbers to 1000 in numerals and words, comparing and ordering numbers to 1000, recognising the place value of each digit in a three-digit number and using formal written methods to add and subtract numbers. All pupils will continue to work on their personal key instant recall facts which will improve their mental calculations and support the Numeracy work they are focusing on in school. It is important that pupils learn and practise this target at home each week as part of their Numeracy homework. Pupils will be tested on their target every <u>Tuesday</u> in class. |
| Science | <u>Material Monsters</u> In this unit of work pupils will learn about the uses of everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, glass, brick, paper and cardboard. Pupils will compare the suitability of different everyday materials for different purposes. They will also explore how objects made of some everyday materials can change shape and how the recycling process is able to reuse some everyday materials numerous times. |
| Geography | <u>Weather Experts</u> In this unit of work, the children will learn about weather and seasons. They will focus on the weather in the local area, as well as looking at the wider perspective of the UK. The children will observe, spot seasonal patterns and talk about changes by using weather related vocabulary. |
| Art and DT | Drawing and Painting Art work this half term will be linked to the class geography topic. Pupils will focus on the themes of clouds, water and different weather conditions to work on developing their drawing and painting skills. |
| Music | Musical Me Pupils will work on using their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs, speaking chants and rhymes. |
| P.E. | Invasion Games Class Three will be having weekly tennis lessons this half term. These sessions will take place on a <u>Thursday morning</u> and will be conducted by coaches from Skipton Tennis Centre. |
| R.E. | <u>Creation: Who Made The World?</u> In this unit of work pupils will learn that God created the universe and that the Earth and everything in it are important to God. They will retell the story of creation from Genesis and will be able to say what the story tells Christians about God, creation and the world. They will think about the importance of caring for the world because it belongs to God and will think/ talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world. |
| P.S.H.C. E. | <u>Me and My Relationships</u> Through this unit of work pupils will understand and respect the differences and similarities between people. Pupils will learn about the biological differences between male and female animals and their role in the life cycle and also the biological differences between male and female children. They will find out about growing from young to old and will learn that they are growing and changing. Furthermore, they will think about different types of families and how their home-life is special. |
| Computing | <u>Coding</u> Pupils will find out that an algorithm is a set of instructions and will understand that for the computer to make something happen, it needs to follow clear instructions. They will create a simple computer program that uses the repeat and timer commands and will also be able to debug simple programs. |
| French | <u>Core Unit One</u> Pupils will work on saying, reading and writing some basic French greetings. They will learn the numbers 1-10 in the French language and will be able to respond to some simple classroom instructions. |
