**Year Reception Spring Term 2 Curriculum Map 2022**

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<p><b><u>Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne</u></b></p> <p>Pupils will explore the story through different lenses and plot points. They will investigate and develop a wide range of vocabulary and construct sentences which include feelings, actions and noticing. Pupils will then use story language to plan and retell the story independently.</p>
Maths	<p>In Maths pupils will carry out a unit called <b>building 9 and 10</b>. They will begin by representing and sorting 9 and 10 before ordering numbers. Pupils will explore the composition of 9 and 10 and learn to count backwards.</p> <p><i>Please continue to work on their personal <u>key instant recall facts</u> and develop skills on <u>NumBots</u> which will help to improve their mental calculations. It is important that they learn and practise this target at home each week as part of their Maths homework. Pupils will continue to be tested on their target every other <b>Tuesday / Wednesday</b> in class.</i></p>
Science	<p><b><u>Seasonal Change</u></b> In this unit of work children will learn about the changes that occur in spring. They will learn that flowers and plants come out in spring and identify a range of flowers. Children will go on a 'Spring Walk' around the village to investigate the signs of spring. They will also observe the chick hatching process first-hand in the classroom. During science lessons, pupils will explore a range of art materials to make observational drawings of plants and animals, and create a model of a chick and egg using clay.</p>
History	<p><b><u>Antarctic Explorer</u></b> Pupils will learn all about the famous Antarctic explorer Ernest Shackleton. They will learn about Shackleton's adventures and attempts to reach the South Pole with his crew.</p>
Art	<p><b><u>Clay</u></b> Pupils will use their hands to manipulate clay by pushing, rolling, squeezing, poking, pinching and twisting. They will learn to use water to smooth and secure, and make models.</p>
Music	<p><b><u>My Stories</u></b> Pupils will learn to sing along with nursery rhymes and action songs. They will listen and respond to different styles of music, exploring a wide range of songs. Pupils will learn to find the pulse and copy-clap the rhythm of small phrases from the songs. They will explore high pitch and low pitch in the context of the songs. And invent a pattern to go with a song using a note.</p>
P.E.	<p><b><u>Tennis</u></b> Reception will take part in PE lessons delivered by Skipton Tennis Centre on a <b>Friday</b> during this half term. In their PE unit of work, the children will carry out work with bean bags, balls and rackets. They will work on team activities using cones, throw down markers, larger balls such as footballs and air balls. Pupils will also play floor</p>

	tennis which will cover attacking and defending with skills such as pushing the ball along the floor and defending the receiving ball.
<b>R.E.</b>	<b><u>Which times are special and why?</u></b> During this unit children will explore this big question and begin by sharing special occasions that they have celebrated during their lives. They will learn the Easter story and understand why this special festival is important to Christians.
<b>P.S.H.E</b>	<b><u>Healthy Me</u></b> Children will learn the importance of exercise in order to keep our bodies healthy. They will learn the meaning of the word 'healthy' and that some foods are healthier than others. Children will learn that when we sleep, we grow and our bodies repair themselves. Finally, they will learn what a stranger is and how to stay safe if a stranger approaches them.
<b>Computing</b>	<b><u>Word Processing</u></b> Pupils will develop their typing skills using the keyboard letters to type their name and words. They will learn to recognise and use the space bar and enter key.
