Dear parents and carers,

We have been very busy with Easter activities this week. Yesterday we held our Easter service in church. NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme

We will be participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme during the first two weeks after Easter. This is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11.
