Y4 trip to Liverpool

On Tuesday, Year 4 had a wonderful trip out to Liverpool World Museum. They are currently learning about Ancient Egypt so whilst at the museum they were lucky enough to see many artefacts and learn facts about the Ancient Egyptians.

The children took part in a mummification workshop, which enabled them to see the full process of mummification (on a pretend human!). They learnt about the different canopic jars that the organs are kept in and took part in wrapping up the body. Some children took their role of 'embalmer' very seriously.

The children also saw some real mummies, mummified animals and ancient sarcophaguses. It was a fantastic day out. Plus, they also took a little tour around the aquarium floor!



Islam workshop

We had a fabulous day on Monday with Yasmien Bagh Ali who came in to school to run an Islam Faith workshop for KS2 children. She started the day with an assembly for the whole school where she introduced herself in Punjabi and introduced the children to religious Islamic dress and traditional cultural dress. During the KS2 workshops she talked about the 5 pillars of Islam and how Muslims look after their holy book, the Quran. The children also learnt how to write their names in Arabic, dressed in cultural clothing and learnt some dance moves. It was a brilliant day and everyone learnt such a lot!

Parking at school

Set off sooner if you can

Park further away from the school and walk with your children to the school gates;

Wear appropriate bright clothing to make you and your child visible to motorists;

Drive slowly - Be aware of children attempting to cross the road between parked cars.

Pedestrians - do not attempt to cross the road between parked cars unless there is no other option, and only if you must.
