**Our Curricular Goals:** 

To develop pupils' knowledge of Christianity, and other world faiths, enabling them to have an understanding, appreciation and celebration of the rich diversity of religious belief and practice in the locality and society today, to build a strong sense of identity and belonging.

To enable children to call upon their faith, values and understanding during times of need and as judgement in difficult situations. To encourage pupils to explore challenging questions about faith and their own beliefs, values and experiences.

These units develop pupils' abilities to **make sense of texts** related to the core concepts, to understand the **impact of belief** in these concepts in the lives of Christians and other believers in the community, and to **make connections** beyond the concepts with other learning, including pupils' own responses.

#### The principal aim of RE is to enable pupils to hold balanced and informed conversations about religion and belief.
