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Year 5 Spring Term 2 Curriculum Map 2022

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<u>Narrative</u> Pupils will be watching and exploring all about the video: The Present by Jacob Frey. Through this, they will investigate a range of sentence structures which will include: relative clauses, onomatopoeia, dialogue and time adverbials. Pupils will then use these structures to write their own narrative.
Maths	In Maths, we will be looking at <u>Fractions</u> . Within this topic, pupils work on skills such as changing improper fractions to mixed numbers, mixed numbers to improper fractions, number sequences and compare and order fractions less than 1 and greater than 1. Pupils will continue to work on their personal key instant recall facts and timetables, which will help to improve their mental calculations. It is important that they learn and practise this target at home each week as part of their Maths homework. Pupils will continue to be assessed on their targets in class. Please support your child with this routine by ensuring their KIRF target booklet and Timetables card are available in their reading bags.
Science	<u>Sound</u> In this topic, pupils will learn that sounds can be high or low (pitched) and how to describe that sounds are made when objects vibrate but recognise that not all objects can be seen to vibrate. Also they will learn to recognise that vibrations can travel at different speeds through different mediums.
History	<u>Anglo Saxon and the Vikings</u> Pupils will continue with their journey on the enquiry process of whether The Anglo-Saxons and Vikings were the same people and were nothing but vicious invaders. They will continue with looking at the similarities and differences as well as the legacies they left behind.
DT	Pupils will look at <u>Mechanical Systems</u> . They will learn to make an automata toy of their own for a Toy shop window- including a range of cams.
Music	<u>Make You Feel My Love</u> -This unit of Work is focused around one song: Make You Feel My Love. The material presents an integrated approach to music where games, elements of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc), singing and playing instruments are all linked. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise other Pop Ballads.
P.E.	<u>Tag Rugby</u> This half term, Year 5 will have rugby with Hedley Verity on Tuesdays and another PE lesson on Wednesdays. This second lesson, will be striking, catching and running skills. Alongside this, they will also learn: attacking & defensive skills in isolation and in combinations.
R.E.	<u>If God is everywhere, why go to a place of worship?</u> In this unit of work pupils will make connections between how believers feel about places of worship in different traditions. Select and describe the most important functions of a place of worship for the community. Give examples of how places of worship support believers in difficult times, explaining why this matters to believers. Present ideas about the importance of people in a place of worship, rather than the place itself.

P.S.H.E

Healthy Me. In this unit, the children will learn about the health risks of smoking and the affects this has on lungs, liver and heart.They will learn some of the risks associated with misusing alcohol, including anti-social behaviour, and how it affects the liver and heart. They will learn about basic emergency aid procedures (including recovery position) and know how to get help in emergency situations

Computing

Databases- In this unit the children will learn how to search for information in a database, contribute to a class database. and create a database around a chosen topic.
