**Year 3 Summer Term 1 Curriculum Map 2022**

Curriculum Area	Topics
English	<p><b><u>Narrative: The Secret of Black Rock by Joe Todd-Stanton:</u></b> This surreal modern folk-tale tells the story of an adventurous young girl who must protect a peaceful living creature. We will build sentences as a class around the plot points of this story using a variety of writing rainbow lenses. We will then embark on an independent write using the story as our stimulus.</p> <p><b><u>Poetry:</u></b> We will be working on colour, imagery, rhythm and rhyme using 'I Asked The Little Boy Who Couldn't See' as our model poem.</p>
Math	<p><b><u>Fractions:</u></b> The time that was allocated for fractions in the Spring term was dedicated to recapping the fractions content from year 2. We will now move exploring tenths, tenths as a decimal as well as equivalent fractions. The children will learn to order and compare fractions as well as add and subtract fractions.</p> <p><b><u>Time:</u></b> the children will be able to tell the time to the hour, half hour and quarter of an hour before moving on to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes and then the nearest minute.</p>
Science	<p><b><u>Plants:</u></b> In this unit we will be learning about the functions of different parts of flowering plants and what is required of plants for life and growth and how they vary. Along with the way in which water is transported within plants, as well as studying the life cycle of flowering plants.</p>
Geography	<p><b><u>Our local area</u></b> This half term Year 3 will learn more about Carleton in Craven. They will be able to locate it on a map of the UK and describe its position using compass points. They will have a chance to study different types of maps of the local area and create maps themselves. We will also have a field trip into the village to collect data.</p>
Art	<p><b><u>Formal elements of Art</u></b> Year 3 will be exploring two of the formal elements of art: shape and tone. They will find shapes in everyday objects; use shapes as guidelines to draw accurately from observation; create form and shape using wire and practice shading neatly and from light to dark</p>
RE	<p><b><u>What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?</u></b> Year 3 will learn about how Christians show their beliefs in their daily life, homes and when they are in church. They will also be able to describe how Christians make a difference in their local community and worldwide.</p>
P.E.	<p><b><u>Skipton Tennis Centre:</u></b> this half term one of our weekly PE sessions will be delivered by a STC specialist coach.</p> <p><b><u>Net &amp; Wall Games:</u></b> our remaining weekly PE session will focus on Net &amp; Wall activities - specifically developing our under arm throws, catching and one/two hand strike for accuracy.</p>
Music	<p><b><u>Bringing Us Together:</u></b> All the learning in this unit is focused around one song: Bringing Us Together - a Disco song about friendship, peace, hope and unity. We will listen &amp; praise the song then learn to sing it. Using the glockenspiel we will experiment and improvise and then compose our own music to accompany the song.</p>
P.S.H.E	<p><b><u>Relationships:</u></b> In this unit the children will look at family roles and responsibilities as well as friendship and how we can negotiate conflict. To know and show what makes a good relationship and also re visit online safety.</p>
Computing	<p><b><u>Branching Databases:</u></b> A branching database is sometimes referred to as a 'binary tree' or a 'key'. Branching databases classify groups of objects. • The children will be creating their own branching databases. If done</p>

	correctly, someone else should be able to use it to identify an object that they have in front of them, e.g., to find out the name of an insect, a fruit or vegetable by using a series of simple questions and yes/no answers. The children will test each other's branching databases.
<b>French</b>	<b>Core units:</b> Children will continue to practise and recall the vocabulary they have already learned in French. They will also learn how to describe the parts of their body and how to count up to 31. They will learn to describe items of clothing and will recap the months of the year. They will finish by reading and translating a story about a birthday party.
