

**Year 1 Summer Term 2 Curriculum Map 2022**

Curriculum Area	Topics
<b>English</b>	<b><u>Narrative Writing.</u></b> Pupils will be reading ‘The Train Ride’ by June Crebbin. Through this, they will investigate sentences which will include adjectives, similes, onomatopoeia, dialogue, and questions. Pupils will then use the structure from shared writing to write their own narrative.
<b>Maths</b>	In Maths we will be looking at the areas of position and direction, place value within 100, money and time. Pupils will continue to work on their personal key instant recall facts which will help to improve their mental calculations. It is important that they learn and practise this target at home each week as part of their Maths homework. Pupils will continue to be assessed on their target every other <b>Friday</b> in class. Please support your child with this routine by ensuring their KIRF book is readily available in their reading bags.
<b>Science</b>	<b><u>Animals Including Humans: The human body and the five senses –</u></b> The pupils will learn about five of the groups used to classify animals: mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians. They will learn to identify the group an animal belongs to by its features and will classify animals according to their group. They will also learn about the different diets of animals. Children will learn about the parts of the human body and have the opportunity to explore the five senses through a simple investigation.
<b>History</b>	<b><u>Greatest Inventions – The Railway.</u></b> Pupils will explore the stories of two significant events in the history of travel, and the impact they had on people’s lives, back then and in the future.
<b>DT</b>	<b><u>Food - Preparing fruit and vegetables –</u></b> The children will be able to distinguish between a fruit and vegetable. They will know where fruit and vegetables grow. They will also be designing and making a smoothie.
<b>Music</b>	<b><u>Reflect, Rewind and Replay</u></b> Pupils will continue to develop their understanding of pulse, rhythm and pitch through musical games. They will listen to and appraise to a range of music from the history of music, from Early Music to Contemporary, reflecting on the musical elements they hear within the songs, and their own personal reactions.
<b>P.E.</b>	<b><u>Skills – jumping, throwing, and running.</u></b> This half term, Year One will continue to have their PE lessons on <b>Mondays and Thursdays.</b>
<b>R.E.</b>	<b><u>What is the good news Jesus brings?</u></b> Pupils will learn about stories from the Bible and the good news Jesus brings. They will recognise that Jesus gives instructions about how to behave. Look at examples of how Christians bring good news to their communities.
<b>P.S.H.E</b>	<b><u>Changing me -</u></b> Pupils will know the ways that they have changed since being a baby and know the main body parts that make boys and girls different. They will know some of the correct

names for these and that they are private.
