## Year 5 Summer Term 1 Curriculum Map 2025

Curriculum Area	Topics
<b>English</b>	In their narrative work, the children will focus on the narrative <b><u>The Nowhere Emporium by Ross Mackenzie</u></b> . The children will use this story to craft and construct different sentences which will develop the children's understanding of grammar, spelling and punctuation knowledge. The children will then complete an independent write, enabling the children to apply what they have learned from this unit.
<b>Maths</b>	The children will start the term by learning <b><u>shape</u></b> . In this unit, the children will learn how to draw and measure angles. The children will learn how to measure and find missing angles around a point and on a straight line. The children will then move onto <b><u>decimals</u></b> . This unit builds on their previous unit of decimals and will focus on how to use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division with decimal numbers.
<b>Science</b>	<b><u>Consolidation</u></b> – In this unit, the children will revisit, consolidate and build on prior knowledge from previous Science units (animals including humans, Earth and space, materials and properties and forces). The children will develop their working scientifically skills within these units and will take part in various scientific experiments which link to these units.
<b>Geography</b>	<b><u>My region and the Western United States</u></b> – In this unit, children will recap the key human and physical features of their region in England. Children will discover the different countries and capital cities of North America and then focus on specifically the Western United States. Children will learn the human and physical features of the Western United States including biomes, climate zones, vegetation belts, earthquakes and volcanoes. Children will learn about the physical processes of rivers, mountains and the water cycle and apply this to their region and the Western United States.
<b>Art</b>	<b><u>Painting and mixed media portraits</u></b> – In this unit, the children will engage in opportunities to develop skills in creating interesting portrait drawings using words, experimenting with materials and techniques and constructing self-portraits that represent aspects of themselves. The children will develop their understanding and application of art vocabulary and will be encouraged to make thoughtful decisions in their artwork composition.
<b>Music</b>	<b><u>Fresh Prince of Bel Air</u></b> – In this unit, the learning is focused on the song 'Fresh Prince of Bel Air' by Will Smith. The children will take part in a variety of games and activities, which will help them to learn about the different dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.) within the song. The children will learn to sing the song and then use recorders and glockenspiels to play the song instrumentally.
<b>P.E.</b>	<b><u>Swimming</u></b> – The children will have swimming lessons at the Craven Leisure Centre on <b><u>Monday afternoons</u></b> . Please ensure children come to school with the appropriate swimming kit.
<b>R.E.</b>	<b><u>Why is pilgrimage important to some religious believers?</u></b> – In this unit, the children will learn the difference between a place that is considered 'special' and a place that is considered 'holy' or 'sacred'. The children will learn about the role of pilgrimage across different religions and will learn about the similarities and differences between ways in which people undertake pilgrimage. The children will also be able to link the stories that lie behind sites, times and places of pilgrimage.
<b>P.S.H.E.</b>	<b><u>Healthy Me</u></b> – In this unit, children will look at the health risks associated with smoking, vaping and misusing alcohol. The children will look at both physical and mental risks and what these risks look like. The children will learn basic emergency procedures and practice these, such as the recovery position, and they will learn how to get help if they find themselves in an emergency. The children will also learn about the influence the media, social media and celebrity culture has on certain body types and certain foods and diets.
<b>Computing</b>	<b><u>Introduction to vector graphics</u></b> – In this unit, children start to create vector drawings. They learn how to use different drawing tools to help them create images. Children will recognise that images in vector drawings are created using shapes and lines, and each individual element in the drawing is called an object. They will layer their objects and begin grouping and duplicating them to support the creation of more complex pieces of work.
<b>French</b>	<b><u>A school trip</u></b> – This unit is all about school trips. It introduces vocabulary to talk about the journey, including the French version of "The Wheels on the Bus", and words associated with trips to a museum and the countryside. The unit includes sentences in both the present and future tenses, giving pupils the opportunity to learn new sentence structures.
