**Year 6 Summer Term 2 Curriculum Map 2022**

Curriculum Area	Topics
<b>English</b>	<p>This half term we will begin by looking at the book 'A Monster Calls' by Patrick Ness. In this unit children will develop their understanding of suspense writing and write their own setting description and chapter of the story.</p> <p>In non-fiction we will look at writing biographies and autobiographies and children will develop their understanding of formal writing and cohesive devices. In grammar, we will be revising punctuation and children will learn how to use dashes, colons and semi colons accurately in their writing.</p>
<b>Maths</b>	<p><b><u>In Maths we will be exploring 2D and 3D shapes.</u></b> Children will learn how to identify their properties and classify them according to their characteristics. They will learn more about the nets of 3D shapes, identify different angles and carry out investigations about regular and irregular polygons. We will revise key areas of ratio, proportion and algebra so that children have consolidated their understanding and building on their skills ready for secondary school.</p>
<b>Science</b>	<p><b><u>Living things and their habitats-</u></b> This term we are going to be exploring living things and their habitats. This will include an introduction to the Linnaeus classification system and work on micro-organisms, including the work of Jenner, Pasteur and Fleming. Children will go on to drawing their own classification keys for different animals.</p>
<b>History</b>	<p><b><u>The Ancient Mayans-</u></b> In this unit of work the children will learn all about the Ancient Mayan civilisation. They will learn about where they settled, what daily life was like for Mayans, the gods and their farming techniques. They will also find out all about the decline of the civilisation and the legacy they left behind.</p>
<b>DT</b>	<p>In DT this half term children will be designing and creating their own waist coats. They will be choosing their own fabrics and design to create their own unique waist coat.</p>
<b>Music</b>	<p><b><u>Friendship</u></b> You've Got a Friend. Children will continue to learn to sing the song You've got a friend by Carol King. They will develop their understanding of pitch, pulse and rhythm. They will then accompany the song with the recorder and glockenspiel. They will also work on performing a song for their end of year show.</p>
<b>P.E.</b>	<p><b><u>Year 6 PE days this half term are Friday and Tuesdays.</u></b> Children will continue to have Skipton Tennis centre on a Friday afternoon and on a Tuesday they will be developing their athletics skills as well as jumping and throwing.</p>
<b>R.E.</b>	<p><b><u>Is it better to express your religion in arts and architecture or in charity and generosity?</u></b> Children will compare two different religions Christianity and Islam and explore ways in which they support charity and also compare the architecture of their religious buildings. Children will then examine their own view point based on what they have learnt in this unit.</p>
<b>P.S.H.E</b>	<p><b><u>Relationships</u></b> We will look at what constitutes a healthy relationship, the changes both the male and female body go through during puberty and how babies are made. You will receive a letter this week that outlines in more detail the whole school policy and approach to this area of the curriculum.</p>
<b>Computin</b>	<p><b><u>Binary</u></b> Children will develop their understanding of binary as a number system and its purpose and</p>

<b>g</b>	application in computing. They will learn about how Computers use binary to process data. There are simple techniques to convert between binary and denary and to add two binary numbers together.
<b>French</b>	Our topic this half term is about family and builds on the family vocabulary from Core Unit 1. As well as introducing vocabulary for some extended family members, we will cover how to talk about household tasks and family-based weekend activities. The lessons in this unit include sentences in the present and past tense.
